continues to work with the public bodies to ensure that we are meeting the needs of Nunavummiut under the ATIPP Act. Although we work cooperatively with the public bodies, we may not be able to directly speak to some of the concerns raised by the Standing Committee, as we are not directly responsible for ATIPP functions within the departments. While the ATIPP office coordinates and tracks ATIPP responses, each public body is responsible for its own implementation of the ATIPP Act.

The government gives careful consideration to all recommendations made by the commissioner and the Standing Committee to determine how best to implement them. In May 2013, the amendments to the ATIPP Act came into force, subjecting all public bodies to increased obligations to protect personal privacy and provided the commissioner with oversight under the privacy provisions of the Act. To support these legislative changes, the department has created various resource materials and provided numerous training opportunities to employees to ensure meaningful compliance.

We have also made administrative changes that have improved ATIPP administration. The following is a list of work done by the government in response to the recommendations made by the commissioner and this Standing Committee over the years:

- The GN continues to review the list of public bodies found in the ATIPP regulations to ensure the list reflects the organizational changes that have occurred since the creation of Nunavut.
- Regular and meaningful training is

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- Each public body has designated an ATIPP coordinator to administer the Act. This includes two departments which have designated full-time ATIPP coordinators.
- The GN has created and distributed the ATIPP directory throughout Nunavut, both on the access and privacy website and in paper form through our government liaison offices. This document is available in all four official languages.
- The GN takes pride in tabling an annual report on the administration of the ATIPP Act and this practice will continue. This report includes the statistics related to the administration of the Act, including the number of requests to which public bodies, time spent processing requests, fees charged, and the language in which the request was placed and released.
- In the spirit of building transparency into our contracting, the GN has created a website that provides contract details by department that is accessible to the public.
- The GN has a comprehensive records management system which governs both paper and electronic records under the custody and control of all departments.
- Privacy impact assessments are done on a regular basis to ensure any changes to existing or new programs and databases are privacy compliant

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While we are pleased with the work we have accomplished to date, we continue to work toward the improvement of the ATIPP function. Municipalities are an important level of community government in Nunavut. There is a huge discrepancy between the capacities of the larger communities versus the smaller communities and this is being considered as we move forward with consultations. Engagement with the three major regional centres has progressed and we continue options for their inclusion. A joint working group has been established between the ATIPP office and the City of Iqaluit, which stemmed from a training session for city staff held in February 2014.	
The ATIPP manager appeared before the Iqaluit City Council later that month to discuss the future of ATIPP for the city. The mayor and council were supportive of implementation of the access and privacy principles within the city. (interpretation) In May 2014, training sessions were offered to both Rankin Inlet and Cambridge Bay staff and councils. training while Cambridge Bay council decided to engage the Nunavut Association of Municipalities before taking on any access and privacy training.

(interpretation ends) The ATIPP Act is a major responsibility and as such, the GN cannot make this decision unilaterally without full representation from all stakeholders. We need to find a way to include the municipalities of Nunavut under the ATIPP Act that will allow for a successful transition. It should be noted that the inclusion of municipalities under the ATIPP regulations will require a review of the legislation to ensure the current wording of the Act is appropriate for another level of government.

• *Personal Health Information*. The Government of Nunavut has very strict privacy directives related to the handling of personal health information in the electronic health records system. These directives, along with the ATIPP Act, provide strong legislative and regulatory controls over the protection of personal health information. This legislation falls under the Department of Health, who have committed to developing health-specific privacy legislation in the 2014-17 business plan.

For an example, there was one contract mentioned in the \$70 million range where it was just the name of the company that was awarded the contract.

When you were doing your exam yesterday, what level of detail did you find through your pursuing through the website on what level of detail? Are there actual copies of the contracts in there? Or portions of the contracts? Mr. Akeeagok.

Mr. Akeeagok (interpretation): Thank you, Mr. Chairman. (interpretation ends) What was in the commissioner's report is if you click for the sealift, that's the level of information you will receive. For the actual contract, I didn't find it in terms of through the website. But there are other ways or forms of getting those. We work closely with those recommendations and those recommendations lead to overall administrative changes to the ATIPP function. Those are lead by ATIPP officers with any larger administrative changes going through the ATIPP coordinator committee and reported to the central accountability committee of deputies. We do have that function in terms of to try and address the recommendations that she has done and each recommendation requires different responses.

I think in my opening comments the ongoing recommendations that she has done over the years is on municipalities. I'm quite pleased that we are taking the steps towards hopefully reaching some of our recommendations but it's one that we need to work very closely with other bodies in terms of convincing or assisting in terms of applying the Act. Each recommendation I think requires a specific response and we do that through our annual response to her report. (interpretation) Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

program, geared specifically for the communities was opened and three communities attended the workshop here in Iqaluit. I spoke to this earlier, and regarding future plans to offer training programs, whenever a program is offered to our public servants, we also provide spaces and welcome any community official who wants to attend. We will try to continue this practice. The Hamlet of Cambridge Bay, to use them as an example, stated that the department should utilize existing bodies, such as the Nunavut Association of Municipalities and to try to provide opportunities. Those were their recommendations and we will work with the NAM body on this initiative and to ensure all municipalities implement the legislation and whenever they want training, we offer that as well. That is how things stand, but there are other emerging technologies we are starting to use, such as when Ms. Bell stated that the telehealth equipment has been used to provide training. We try to use all avenues and to be open to different methods such as when we know associations are meeting; we usually present the information and welcome them to check it out. This legislation is quite important, and if you want further details about the legislation, we are open to those types of requests. Thank you, Mr. Chairman. Chairman: Thank you. He was an early part of the administration and creation of our administrative function of ATIPP within the Government of Nunavut. He's well versed on our legislation as well as legislation throughout the country. He has been providing training, as I said, since 2001-02. He provides annual training, usually twice to three times a year where possible. It's a week-long training that we offer to various groups within the Government of Nunavut. He offers it as well as a representative from the ATIPP office who provides more of a	Λ ()

local context as needed.

We have been looking at various options for continued training within the GN as well as to municipalities and other organizations as we expand the scope of the ATIPP act and we're looking at options for creating more internal training as well as what may be required by an external consultant as well.

As for numbers, we haven't put it together yet, but we're moving in that direction. Thank you, Mr. Chairman.

Chairman: Thank you for that response. I'm just wondering which path to go down now. In some of the responses that we have been getting.... I'm trying to think of how to word this appropriately. You have recognized the authority of other government agencies with their own responsibilities of access to information and privacy, but I think one thing that I question is maybe your department's lack of oversight or maybe some of the commitment level and obligations that those departments have to you as a central agency.

I would like to see a little bit more, maybe, teeth to some of your requests. Maybe it's just my opinion that it seems maybe you have been a little complacent in receiving some of the information that has been requested by your department.
