- Kitikmeot Tradeshow Student Program The 2018 Kitikmeot Tradeshow Student Program brought together two youth from each Kitikmeot community. The two students are Inuit role models selected by their High School Principals. The Youth get a glimpse at the present businesses in our region and inspire the young-people to become entrepreneurs and leaders in their home communities. The KTS Student program purpose:
 - → Expose and engage youth to the vital often unspoken skills that one gains after years of experience in the professional world of business such as: Networking, Public speaking, introducing yourself, body language, and more.
 - → Inuit Financial Literacy Toolkit Training (Developed by ITK, NIYC- RIA Youth Reps, and the Economic Club of Canada)
 - → Goal-Setting Activity facilitated by Students on Ice's Caitlyn Baikie.
 - → Presentations by Special Guest Speakers like: Senator Dennis Patterson, KIA Executive Director Paul Emingak, Language Commissioner Helen Klengenberg, Diavik Tara and Rebecca, Polar Knowledge Canada Staff, Inspire Nunavut Staff, Students on Ice Caitlyn Baikie and Heather Dewar, and more.
 - → Toured the Canadian High Arctic Research Station and the Nunavut Arctic College Campus
- Kitikmeot Youth Empowerment Gathering The purpose of the Gathering was to analyze the state of the Kitikmeot Youth, and continue to move forward to create healthy and active youth presence in each of the Kitikmeot Communities. Key Highlights of the Gathering:
 - → The Gathering took place in Cambridge Bay, Nunavut at the Kitikmeot Inuit Association Patrick Lyall Boardroom
 - → The facilitators were: Sarah Jancke, Julia Ogina, Kiah Hachey, Leslie Inuujaq-Fredlund, Nicole Etitiq and Presley Taylor.
 - → The program provided qualitative activities, panel discussions, break- out groups and presentations based on the Theme of the Day. Each day of the program was based on a theme established and created by the youth priorities from the 2017 Kitikmeot Annual General Meeting Youth Resolutions.
