Subject: Immediate Federal Funding Required for Critical Health and Infrastructure Projects

## **Purpose**

To secure immediate Federal funding for urgent public health, safety, and economic development priorities in Pond Inlet, Nunavut. These matters require action now to prevent further harm and long-term socio-economic consequences.

# **Background & Current Situation**

## 1. Mental Health Crisis Following Tragedy

- **Event:** Pond Inlet has suffered the suicides of two 13-year-old children and one 10-year-old child.
- **Federal Commitment:** Previous verbal assurances of funding for mental health and healing services have not yet been fulfilled.

#### • Impact:

- o In a small northern community where nearly, all residents are connected by family or friendship, such tragedies cause deep, widespread grief.
- o The loss has triggered community-wide trauma, strained limited counselling resources, and increased mental health risks for both youth and adults.
- Without intervention, the emotional harm will have generational impacts.
- Need: Immediate, culturally appropriate, and sustained counselling and support programs.

#### 2. Paved & Extended Airstrip

- **Problem:** The current gravel runway is too short to accommodate jet service.
- Impact:
  - Increased cost of goods and travel.

- o Limited medical evacuation capabilities.
- o Lost opportunity for Pond Inlet to function as a regional hub.
- **Proposed Action:** Federal investment in extending and paving the runway to enable regular jet service and improve supply reliability.

## 3. Safe Drinking Water

- **Problem:** Longstanding water quality issues remain unresolved. A planned new water station has been in "planning" for nearly four years; the geotechnical study is still incomplete.
- Impact:
  - Ongoing public health risks.
  - Declining trust in basic services.
- Proposed Action: Immediate funding to complete site work and commence construction.

#### 4. Bridge Over Salmon Creek

- **Problem:** Absence of a permanent bridge leaves critical routes vulnerable to unsafe or impassable conditions.
- Impact:
  - Delayed emergency responses.
  - Unsafe travel for residents.
- **Proposed Action:** Federal funding for engineering, design, and construction of a permanent bridge.

#### 5. Road Paving & Dust Mitigation

- **Problem:** Gravel roads generate severe dust pollution, worsening respiratory conditions and reducing quality of life.
- Impact:
  - o Increased strain on the health care system.
  - o Damage to property and infrastructure.
- **Proposed Action:** Federal support to pave primary roads and reduce dust-related health issues.

# **Consequences of Inaction**

- Worsening mental health crisis, particularly among youth.
- Continued infrastructure-related safety risks.
- Preventable health problems from poor air and water quality.
- Loss of economic opportunities and higher cost of living.

#### Recommendation

That the Federal Government:

- 1. Commit immediate funding for mental health services in Pond Inlet.
- 2. Allocate dedicated infrastructure funds for the airstrip, water station, Salmon Creek bridge, and road paving.
- 3. Establish clear timelines for project delivery to ensure no further delays.
